Vision Poster

A large wall poster with a baseball theme or a football theme: "Is Someone You Know Not Seeing the Whole Game?" shows the impact of the four major eye conditions on vision. Football theme poster is also available in a Spanish version.

Vision Simulator Card

Allows the user to experience the impact on vision of the four most common eye diseases: cataract, glaucoma, macular degeneration and diabetic retinopathy. Available in English/Spanish.

Functional Screening for Vision Loss (Screening Card)

A pocket-sized card with questions to screen a person for vision problems that could indicate the need for low vision rehabilitation, and also for depression. Versions available for Eye Care Providers, as well as professionals or informal caregivers who are caring for people with vision loss. A great practice builder.

Guide Techniques (Video and Booklet)

This 10-minute video and full-color, 20-page booklet provide detailed instruction of the guide technique, a safe and effective method to use when offering assistance to a person who is blind or visually impaired, and illustrate other common self-travel techniques. It is a valuable guide for anyone who works with, cares for, or interacts with a person with vision loss.

Assisting People with Vision Loss (Instructional Brochure)

This brochure provides useful and effective tips for sighted people on how to improve personal interactions with people with vision loss. It can be used in conjunction with a training program or as an independent instructional resource.

Signature Guide / Reading Guide

A card that can be used to help people sign their name while staying on the line, and also used to maintain the correct line while reducing the detrimental effects of glare when reading.

Caring for People with Vision Loss (Reference Manual)

A manual that can be used as a resource to supplement a training program or as an independent educational tool. This 57-page

manual describes and illustrates the eye and vision, eye diseases and vision conditions, the impact of vision loss, orientation and mobility techniques, environmental considerations, and ways to promote independence in activities of daily living.
